The following are Project Status Updates for the Utility Services Department:

- Wastewater Treatment Plant Design of expansion/udgrades. Received 30% Plan Design for review. Staff currently reviewing for comment.
- Design of 5.0 million gallon reservoir. Notice of Award to Consultant sent 01/03/2022. In process of Design approximately at 35% design.
- Drilling and Construction of two new Water Wells Nos.32 and 33. Well 33 drilling and construction completed, now in process of design for equipping. Well 32 pilot hole drilled and after initial water quality testing, it has been determined to not proceed any further with additional construction.
- Well 31 equipping almost completed, awainting on delivery and installation of the Motor Control Center (MCC) panel. Current estimated ship date of 03/14/2023.
- Stormwater Capture and Recharge Feasibility Study. Fianl report was received 1/24/23.
 Staff preparing Requests for Proposals for identified projects.
- La Loma Reservoir 2 Approximately 40% Design


Colton Electric Resource Portfolio

- Colton Electric has total 17 projects in different technologies:
 - Green Energy
 - o 1 Wind Project
 - 1 Landfilled Gas Project (SCPPA)
 - 1 Geothermal Project (SCPPA)
 - 4 Small Hydro Projects (SCPPA)
 - o 6 Solar Projects (2 of these are SCPPA's)
 - ➤ Non-Green Energy
 - 2 Natural Gas Projects (1 of these is a SCPPA's)
 - o 1 Large Hydro
 - 1 Nuclear Project (SCPPA)
- SCPPA provides the City economy of scale for our power purchase contracts







Gas Bills Comparison




Historical Budget Comparison of Purchased Power, Transmission & CAISO Charges

FY 2022-23 Purchased Power, Transmission & ISO Charges Budget

FY 2022-23 Adopted Budget	\$ 31,114,793
FY 2022-23 Year-End Projected (Based on current Energy/Gas market)	\$ 52,575,564
Variance (shortfall in budget)	\$ 21,460,771

Steps taken to address the increase in Energy prices variance:

- The Department is deferring lower priority Capital Improvements this FY (e.g. Agua Mansa Power Plant \$2.3M Transfer + \$3.1M Capital Transfer).
- Utilizing approximately \$4.5M reserve funds.
- General Fund Transfer Reduction of \$2M

Next step, The Electric Department will be implementing a PCA for the variance amount of \$21,460,771.

- Replenish reserves to maintain Colton's bond rating of A2.
- Retain stability for next FY budget.
- Resume necessary Capital projects deferred this Fiscal Year.

What is a Power Cost Adjustment (PCA)

Per the Colton Electric Utility Rules and Regulations (Rule No. 23):

A charge added to the energy charge to reflect unusual conditions in the market that, if not addressed, would result in financial harm to the Electric Department.

The **Power Cost Adjustment (PCA)** is a charge per kWh which is used:

- (1) to adjust the Electric Department's electric rates for the actual cost of purchasing and generating electric power and energy to service the City's Customers, and
 - (2) to minimize the fluctuations in rates.

As of beginning of the FY 2015, the PCA was set to zero (\$0.00) but can be changed by the Colton Electric Director as necessary to reflect changes in actual power supply costs.

In response to current Energy market prices, Colton Electric Utility will be implementing a PCA of \$0.085 per kWh.


Colton Electric Rate History


- Colton's rates have not changed for the last 10 years (last updated 7/1/2013)
- The City of Colton's issuer rating was recently upgraded to A2 from A3, by Moody's Investors Service.
- A PCA was last implemented in FY2007 and ended by FY 2015.
- Energy/Gas market prices have been extremely volatile since Fall 2022
- Cost of service study in progress to update rate structure to reflect current consumer price levels.
- Even with the implementation of the \$0.085 PCA Colton's rates will remain lower than that of Edison.

Implementation

- ✓ Re-implement the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA)
 - PCA effective April 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 expected to increase revenue by \$6.7M in remaining FY23 and \$29.1M in FY24.
 - Possibility of PCA Ending June 30, 2024 or sooner pending the results of the rate study that will fulfill the need in providing the reliability and sustainability to the customers.
 - Encourage customers facing an increased financial burden to utilize and apply for Low Income assistance program funded by Colton's Public Benefit Fund and Colton's Energy Efficiency Rebates.
